We provide students with opportunities to take academic risks to instill a quest to learn more. We teach our students to strive for excellence in their learning and achievements.

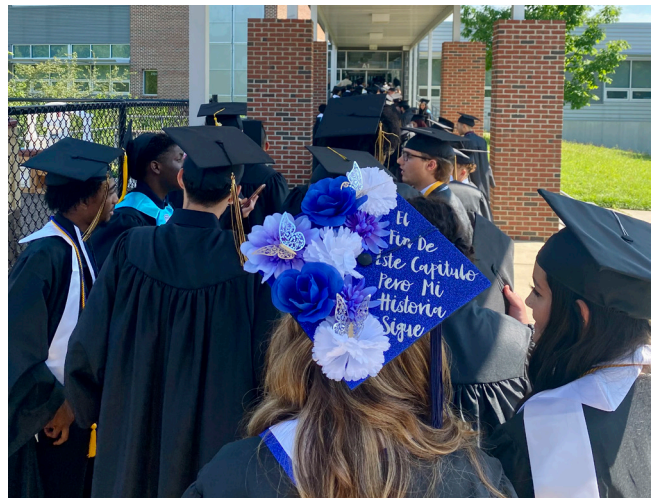
CREATE & CONNECT:

Pillar #1:

Reimagining the School Experience

We will cultivate a positive and purposeful learning environment where students engage in deep and authentic educational experiences.

IMPACT:

We will know we are successful when students and staff are energized by new and different ways to engage with learning, and students unlock their academic potential.

METRIC:

- Decreased rates of chronic absenteeism
- Greater student satisfaction in overall school experience
- Increased use of student-centered learning activities
- Greater alignment in student mastery, grades, and standardized test results



INITIATIVE 1

Provide opportunities to enhance student voice, choice, and creativity in learning

STRATEGIES

- More current pathways, offerings, and partnerships for learning
- Individualized and differentiated professional development
- Specialty learning opportunities for students
- Develop and implement Student Portfolios

INITIATIVE 2

Review instructional practices and grading policies for students to show their progression in learning and mastery of content

STRATEGIES

- Systematic review of current grading policies and practices
- Implement research-based grading policies and practices to align assessments and grading practices

INITIATIVE 3

Create intentional spaces to support student and staff wellness

STRATEGIES

- Increase student club opportunities and participation in athletic programs
- Increase afterschool opportunities in K-8
- Research innovative models for school schedules to support student and staff wellness

Pillar #2:

Building Community and Connection

We will engage the school community in shared purposes and experiences to best support students.

IMPACT:

When there are strong ties within the school community, students feel connected to their learning.

METRIC:

- Decreased rates of chronic absenteeism including removal from class time
- Increased participation in events from families and staff
- Increase in support from local Manassas Park organizations and businesses



INITIATIVE 1

Foster accessible community and family engagement events

STRATEGIES

- Develop Parent Involvement Program and reinstate Parent/Teacher Organizations
- Increase relevant parent/family events at schools or in community
- Review current communication practices for accessibility and inclusivity
- Create a family welcome and resource center

INITIATIVE 2

Develop and maintain relationships with community organizations

STRATEGIES

- Formalize partnership between schools and programs
- Expand Summer Student Employment Program and Work-Based Learning
- Create School Business Partnership programs

INITIATIVE 3

Create or expand programs that support meaningful relationships between and across students and staff

STRATEGIES

- Celebrations for students and staff
- Develop team building and orientation practices
- Implement Student Government at each campus
- Formalize school alumni association

Pillar #3:

Creating Safe Spaces

We will create a school environment that supports the whole child with safety in mind.

IMPACT:

When students feel academically, socially, mentally, and physically safe at school, they are empowered to fully engage in learning and reach their potential.

METRIC:

- Decreased rates of chronic absenteeism
- Increased graduation rates
- Students engaging in academic goal-setting
- Decrease the percentage of students receiving Tier 3 interventions



INITIATIVE 1

Implement mentoring programs for students and staff to foster a greater sense of connection and belonging

STRATEGIES

- Peer mentorship programs within and across schools
- K-12 Student Ambassador Program
- Staff Leader/Ambassador Program
- New Teacher/Administrator Mentor Program
- Orientation Program for New Students

INITIATIVE 2

Equip student support staff to meet the social and emotional needs of students through resources, training, and ensuring accessibility to students

STRATEGIES

- Support the School Resource Officer program and partnership
- Maximize the focus on social, emotional and academic support for students
- Create and implement a tiered intervention system for behavioral and emotional needs
- Provide opportunities for all staff in social, emotional and behavioral supports for students

INITIATIVE 3

Create opportunities for students to reflect on their learning and engage in appropriate academic risk-taking

STRATEGIES

- Implement Project/Problem Based Learning
- Increase CTE and experiential learning opportunities
- Review and evaluate academic program of studies K-12
- Develop program to offer students explicit instruction in organization, engagement, and learning
